## Training Department Courses

*Prince William Sound Community College is Large Enough to Serve You and Small Enough to Care*

8, 24, and 40-Hour HAZWOPER	Initial and refresher HAZWOPER courses designed to meet the requirements of 29 CFR 1910.120 for emergency response to hazardous substance releases and hazardous waste site workers.
Confined Space Awareness Course	Required training for supervisors, attendants, and entrants to comply with Federal Confined Space Entry Regulations under 29 CFR 1910.146.
American Red Cross First Aid/CPR/AED	This course trains lay responders to overcome any reluctance to act in emergency situations and to recognize and care for life-threatening respiratory or cardiac emergencies in adults. Also provides lay responders with the knowledge and skills necessary in an emergency to help sustain life and to minimize pain and the consequences of injury or sudden illness until professional medical help arrives.
North Slope Training Cooperative (NSTC) Unescorted Program	NSTC is a combined effort of BP, Conoco Phillips, Alyeska Pipeline, and their contractors. Training provides health, safety and environmental awareness training. Every employee going to work is required to complete this program before arriving for duty on the North Slope.
AlaskaHost Customer Service Training	AlaskaHost is a statewide customer service training program designed for employees of the hospitality and visitor service industry. The core of the AlaskaHost program trains participants on how to provide quality customer service for both residents and visitors of Alaska.
United States Coast Guard (USCG) 100-Ton Master and Operator Uninspected Passenger Vessel (OUPV) Licenses	Course teaches topics such as weather, First Aid, seamanship, pollution control, navigation, and rules of the road that are necessary to pass the USCG examination to operate a marine vessel for hire.
USCG 10-Hour Onboard Drill Conductor and 18-Hour Survival Equipment, Procedures, and Onboard Drills	Practical information on survival equipment found on commercial vessels and on conducting emergency onboard drills. Courses meet the training requirements for commercial fishermen operating on documented vessels beyond the Boundary Line.
NASBLA Approved Boating Safety Course	Boating Safety is intended for boaters operating small power, wind and paddle-powered vessels on near-shore coastal waters and lakes. It is designed for any boater new to boating in Alaska.
Customized Cold Water Safety and Survival Training	Custom-designed, cold-water and vessel safety courses designed to meet the specific needs of the business or government agencies in marine or freshwater environments.
Fishing Industry Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point (HACCP) Training	Alaska seafood processors are required by law setup and operate under an approved hazard analysis and critical control point (HACCP) program. HACCP training assures seafood is processed safely.
